Here's a look at what Council has been up to lately.

Shaping Strathfield

Council has commenced a comprehensive review of the Strathfield Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2012 which will result in an updated LEP for the Strathfield Local Government Area (LGA) being finalised this year. This review will ensure that current land use controls, provisions and zonings within the LEP are current, appropriate and reflect both State Government and Council policies and priorities.

The LEP must also consider community aspirations, particularly as reflected in the *Strathfield 2040 - Local Strategic Planning Statement* and the *Greater Sydney Commission Eastern City District Plan.*

The draft Strathfield LEP 2021 will be on public exhibition in 2021. At that time, Council will be actively seeking feedback from property owners and members of our community that may be impacted.

COVID-19 Testing

The drive-through testing clinic at Bressington Park on Underwood Rd in Homebush **has been relocated** to Bus Bay B, Edwin Flack Drive, Sydney Olympic Park. The clinic is open 7 days a week from 8.30am - 4pm.

Anyone with even mild cold-like symptoms should be tested. Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, sore/ scratchy throat and shortness of breath.

No bookings are required, and patients are reminded to stay in their car.

For those unable to drive, Concord Hospital conducts Covid-19 testing.

NEW OPEN SPACES

Hudson Park - New Maze and Sensory Garden

As part of NSW Government's commitment to making play spaces more inclusive through the Everyone Can Play initiative, a new maze and sensory garden is currently being installed at Hudson Park, Strathfield.

The new installation includes:

- Interactive and inclusive footpaths
- Stepping stone and bollard mazes
- Raised sensory planter bed
- Inclusive, accessible sensory tunnel

This play space is proudly funded by the NSW Government in association with Strathfield Council.



Crane Street Park

Crane Street Park is open and was installed as part of Council's Community Vision to provide Liveable Neighbourhoods and Community Wellbeing. Head down to Bridge St or Crane St and check out Homebush's latest green space which includes:

- A tree-lined avenue
- Sandstone plinth seating
- Pedestrian solar lighting
- Multi-use grass and hard surface areas.

Funding was provided for the construction of this facility by the Australian Government's Building Our Future - a funding scheme of the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development.

PROJECTS

Homebush Village Upgrade

Work will commence in early 2021 on upgrading the popular Homebush Village, to ensure it effectively meets the needs of the growing population.

As the community has grown and expanded around the Village, it has become increasingly apparent that structural updates are required to improve functionality of the area.

After consulting with the community, your Councillors have elected to:

- Convert Burlington Road to one-way heading south with 90 degree parking.
- Add a round-about at the intersection of Burlington Road and Rochester Street.
- Keep Rochester Street as it already is.
- Implement an additional 22 parking spaces.

Anticipated completion date: June 2021
