<b>Lagerstroemia</b> <b>'Indian Summer'</b> <b>'Lipan'</b>	Crepe Myrtle	5m	Feature highlights are the attractive, patterned bark and the mauve flowers, displayed in panicles throughout the Summer and Autumn months.	13	Strathfield South
<b>Lophostemon confertus</b>	Brush box	10m	A highly valued, medium-sized, evergreen, native tree with a stout trunk, spreading branches and a rounded to pyramidal canopy. Leaves are thick, ovate, glossy dark green above and paler beneath. Staminate white flowers, occurring in threes, are followed by woody, bell shaped capsules.	93	Greenacre Strathfield South
<b>Tristaniopsis laurina</b> <b>'Luscious'</b> <b>PBR</b>	Water Gum	7m	An attractive medium-sized, round canopied tree, that is an improved form of <i>Tristaniopsis laurina</i> , displaying large shiny leaves and coppery-red new growth. The bark is a rich port colour that peels back to reveal mottled cream and light brown stems. Sweetly scented flowers are bright yellow and displayed in clusters at the ends of branches during January and February.	150	Greenacre Strathfield South
<b>Eucalyptus microcorys</b>	Tallowwood	20m+	A large tree with an attractive white flower display between May – December. Useful for shade and ornamental plantings. Flowers produce nectar for honey production or pollen	23	Greenacre
<b>Corymbia maculata</b>	Spotted gum	20m+	A large native tree that is used widely through-out Australia in parks and avenue plantings. Grown for its spotted trunk and its adaptability to a range of soils. Fragrant white flowers display from March-June.	23	Greenacre Strathfield South
<b>Backhousia citriodora</b>	Lemon Scented Myrtle	5m	A small to medium sized tree that has fluffy white flower heads during December – March. The leaves have a strong lemon scent and can be harvested for a range of uses including teas and garnishes.	54	Strathfield South
<b>Elaeocarpus eumundi</b> <b>'Quondong'</b>	Eumundi Quandong	8m	A slow growing, mid-sized rainforest tree with dark green, glossy leaves and flushes of bronze-red new growth. Fringed, cream, scented flowers in November to December are attractive to birds. Fruit is a small blue drupe.	100	Greenacre Strathfield South
