There are 3 coloured bins for rubbish.

Each bin is for different items.



- Red bin household garbage
- Yellow bin recycling
- Green bin garden rubbish.

Litter and dumping rubbish



It is against the law to leave rubbish

- on a footpath
- in a nature area
- on the street.



This is not healthy.

It can cause problems for the community.



People can get a fine for doing this.

You can tell Council if you see this happening.

Animals and pets



There are some rules for owning animals and pets.

Backyard swimming pools



All pools in NSW must go on the NSW Swimming Pool Register.

This is a list of swimming pools in NSW.



The pool owner must make sure their pool is on the register.



If you are building a new swimming pool you must get approval from Council first.



The pool must have a fence so children can not get in.

Trees



The Council has information about trees and planting in the area.

Development Applications



A **Development Application** (DA) is when you ask Council if you can

- · change a building or
- build a new building.



Council will tell you if are allowed to make changes.



You can talk to the Council's Duty Planners about your DA.

Council rates are money that you pay to Council when you own land or a house.

We follow up if someone complains about food safety in a place.




We also teach people how to handle food safely.
