5.1 Winter Warmer in the Square – Councillor Karen Pensabene

5.4 Transport Oriented Development (TOD) Process for Homebush – Councillor Sharangan Maheswaran

I would like to acknowledge and draw attention to the Homebush Precinct Plan currently being undertaken and that there is a webinar tomorrow for the community – 24 July 2024 and in-community session on 27 July 2024. This is effectively a masterplan for the Homebush and North Strathfield areas north of the rail corridor. That area has been subject to extensive development over the last decade, most being from adhoc proposals to Council to rezone land.





The preliminary urban design that has been released shows how residents will access the new metro station at North Strathfield and shows the built form at pedestrian level. It provides for an additional 2,000 jobs in our area and the preservation of areas that support those residential uses. I believe there is work to be done on this plan. I do not believe that adequate plans for the north/south pedestrian movements that would naturally occur from Strathfield Station and the new metro station – North Strathfield. I believe that corridor will become a new hub for this entire city considering the number of people that will alight at both stations.
