Dear Resident,

July was a busy month for Strathfield Council, with the appointment of our New General Manager

Michael Mamo and a full organisational restructure. We are heading in an exciting new direction.

National Tree Day was held at Hudson Park on Sunday 31 July, with over 200 volunteers planting more than 4,000 new plants and shrubs. We planted the first of the turpentine trees on the western side of the park which will become Strathfield's first Urban Forest.

In other news, I met with Optus this month in relation to the overhead cables that pollute our streets. Approximately 70% of these cables are redundant and will need to be removed. I have asked Optus to provide mapping of their cables and a timeline for removal. In the meantime, I urge all residents to assist me by contacting Optus if you have an old redundant Optus cable between your home and the cables in the street. Please seek its immediate removal, which Optus are required to do at no cost.

Our Tree Management DCP updates are on exhibition this month, the proposed changes will seek to remove the requirement for residents to lodge a costly development application for pruning and removal. Council will apply a more common-sense approach to tree

management, prioritising the safety of residents and their property.

Finally, I would like to thank Strathfield Golf Club for bestowing me with the honour of becoming the Patron of their Club. The Club is a great meeting place for our community and also plays a key role in conserving the biodiversity of their part of the Cooks River.

Bushcare Program

Bushcare is an environmental restoration program that Strathfield Council has been running for over 20 years! The aim of Bushcare is to improve habitat for native animals.

Bushcare is fantastic for those doing Duke of Edinburgh, or studying an environmental science/ecology related degree and need volunteer hours.

Anyone can join Bushcare, all you need is a water bottle and fully enclosed shoes. Under 16 years old? Please bring a responsible adult to join the fun.

Our July session saw 9 volunteers and 3 staff members remove 12 large garden waste bags of weeds including madeira vine, which will help native plants flourish!

PROJECTS



Powells Creek Bridges

New pedestrian and cycleway bridge crossings will be installed at Lorraine Street, Hamilton Street and George Street to join parts of the Bay to Bay path, improving connectivity with Bressington and Mason Parks, as well as Ismay Reserve. The Bay to Bay path is a continuous collection of cycle and pedestrian paths linking Botany Bay to Sydney Olympic Park, providing opportunities for active transport and recreation.

The bridge at Lorraine Street was successfully installed on 23 June 2022 and fabrication for the Hamilton Street Bridge has commenced.

The project is funded by the NSW Government under the Parramatta Road Urban Amenity Improvement Program (PRUAIP). PRUAIP is a \$198 million initiative by the NSW Government to improve open space and active transport links along the Parramatta Road corridor.

An additional facet of this project will see public art installed along the bridges. After an extensive expression of interest process, Studio Chris Fox and Mike Daly have been selected to fulfil the project.

Hudson District Park Stage 2 Update

Stage 2 of the Hudson District Park project is on schedule to be completed in late December 2022, with Council set to open half the area in October 2022, featuring a kids playground and courts used for sport.

Works on a kids playground will commence on 15 August including a shade sail and wet pour rubber to increase accessibility in the area. The playground will feature an inclusive double swing, seesaw, inclusive carousal and two active rope installations.

Hard courts along with a natural court will also be installed and include:

- 2 half basketball courts
- 1 half hard netball court
- 1 half futsal court
- 1 grass volleyball court
