Welcome to the December newsletter, our last printed newsletter for 2022. It has been a very big year for Council and myself. The

administration has undergone massive changes, and I would like to thank the staff and our General Manager for their patience and commitment as we navigate our way to a more efficient organisation.

This year, I started my Mayoral Street Meetings which have been an invaluable way to meet residents and hear your issues. Every resident concern was noted down and resolved. I look forward to continuing these meetings in the new year. I have also spent a lot of time visiting local schools, churches and community organisations, which has allowed me to connect with the heart of Strathfield and understand residents more.

2022 has been a year of reflection and review for Strathfield Council. Council and staff have spent a great deal of time uncovering mistakes from previous administrations, considering the challenges we currently face, and determining a way forward. With this in mind, if you haven't already, you will soon receive information about Council's plans to ensure we have long term financial sustainability. The reality is that Council has posted deficits for the past few years and has an asset renewal backlog of \$16.5 million. This means there is insufficient funds to maintain and renew assets such as roads, footpaths, parks and community buildings. The longer we leave this, the worse the problem will become. That is why this Council is taking on the tough decisions now to protect our future.

Council has already made a number of savings and productivity improvements, resulting in \$1.3 million of savings, and increasing to \$2.5 million in 2033. Some of these changes are from Council shifting to delivering only the essential

services. My goal is to make sure that Strathfield is maintained at an extremely high level of cleanliness and our streets are tidy so we can maintain our property values and live in a healthy environment. In order to make these improvements there is a cost associated.
