Prepare Your Development for Electric Vehicles

Did you know that by 2030-2031 the NSW Government is anticipating that more than 50% of new car sales will be of Electric Vehicles (EVs)?

The updated National Construction Code 2022, commencing 1 May 2023, will make it easier for people living in apartments to switch to an electric vehicle. This is due to the inclusion of a provision of base infrastructure for future cabling and control-point installation at the time of the contribution.

Make your development more desirable by installing designated EV spots that you can offer to your potential buyers.
