Our

tree removal and
pruning went
to the Council
Meeting this
month.

These changes allow a more common-sense approach to tree removal and pruning, It will remove the requirement for a development application and significantly reduce the cost to residents. Part of these updates will mean the removal of a tree within Im of a dwelling or half a metre of a boundary fence will be permissible with a requirement to replace it on at least a 2 to 1 basis in a more appropriate location. The trees classified as weed species has also been reviewed.

I have pursued these changes after concerns from many residents that have had to deal with trees which caused damage to their homes or have caused safety concerns to their family. My priority has been to have a common-sense approach on matters which put our residents first. If you have a problematic tree, please contact Council for more information.

Council reported our financial statements and has unfortunately reported a deficit for the third consecutive year. Since my election as Mayor, we have made significant changes resulting in savings of around \$1 million just in employee costs. The reality is that there has been significant financial pressure relating to the maintenance and depreciation of many newly built assets which generate little or no revenue to Council such as playgrounds, synthetic fields and the free community bus.

Although most of these expenditure decisions were made before my time on Council, I have an obligation to let the residents know the facts about the challenges facing Council. In the past communication with residents has been difficult as we no longer have a local paper, that's why this newsletter was introduced under my Mayoralty, to ensure residents have true and accurate information about Strathfield Council with no sugar coating.

I, along with my fellow Councillors, have put forward many motions this year looking at increasing Council's revenue base and also looking at reviewing our service profile for savings. These include an extensive review of the Strathfield Connector Bus, an improved property strategy and an update to our Development Contributions Plan.

We are not the only Sydney council facing challenges but with our history of being strong, independent and financially viable, it is very disappointing that decisions of some predecessors have put the Council on a negative trajectory.

I would like to assure residents that the Council team and I will continue to work in your best interest to resolve these challenges and will have more to say on this in the future.

PROJECTS



Hamilton Street Bridge

Council successfully installed the second of three bridges across Powells Creek at Hamilton Street on 21 September!

The Bridges are part of a Parramatta Road Urban Amenity Improvement Program, and will increase access to Allen St, Mason and Bressington Parks, and Sydney Olympic Park.



The final bridge located at George Street will follow.

The project is funded by the NSW Government under the Parramatta Road Urban Amenity Improvement Program (PRUAIP). PRUAIP is a \$198 million initiative by the NSW Government to improve open space and active transport links along the Parramatta Road corridor.

Strathfield Park Café

As part of Council's Community Vision to provide Liveable Neighbourhoods and support Community Wellbeing, a second amenities building and café are currently being built at Strathfield Park.

The building includes:

- Decking with 225 degree views
- Covered seating
- Male and female toilets
- Parents room with accessible toilet

The final touches are being made with contractors currently installing the decking to the customer seating area. The building is due to be finished at the end of October 2022.

An operator has been engaged to run the café and hopes to have it open to the public before the end of the year.
