Your Rates At Work

One of the key focus areas from Council's SRV application was the renewal of footpaths in the LGA. The SRV Footpath Program for 2023-2024 has more than 110 projects throughout the Strathfield LGA.

23 Frances Ave Strathfield South

Currently, 69 of these footpath projects have been sent to market

seeking quotes. 20 of these are now in construction, a number are either awaiting pricing or have been awarded and yet to commence and the remainder still in the design phase. Council will be undertaking footpath renewal in the upcoming weeks at the following locations: Cutbush Ave, Davidson St, Dean St, Drew St, Ford St, Hampstead Rd, High St, Homebush Rd, The Crescent, Vernona St, Wakeford Rd and Wallis St.

The aim is to have the entire SRV footpath program completed prior to 30 June 2024 (weather permitting).

Western Sydney International Airport

The new Western Sydney International

(Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport (WSI) is set to open for freight, domestic and international travellers in 2026. The Australian Government has released the preliminary flight paths and draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for WSI for the community to view.

Information on the Noise Insulation and Property Acquisition Program can be found in the draft EIS and the draft Noise Insulation and Property Acquisition Policy brochure.

If you would like to make a submission and leave feedback, the draft EIS will be on public exhibition until 31 January 2024.
