We know Councils play a key role in the reduction of waste and its overall impact on the environment. Council will be planning an ongoing education program to reduce waste and improve environmental outcomes where waste is sent and processed.

A reminder that your:

- Green bin is for garden waste such as leaves, branches, twigs and grass
- Yellow bin is for marked recycling bottles, hard plastics, paper and cardboard. Soft plastics should not be placed in your yellow bin.
- Red bin is for general waste.

Waste disposal costs begin to increase dramatically when bins are contaminated with an item that should not be there. Education is key, and we will be working closely with residents to reduce, reuse and recycle many of the items we dispose.

This waste issue is one of great importance and is going to be a major project for our Council over the next 7 years. We will be introducing new waste initiatives, including the State Government requirement that all Councils must have food organics and garden organics (FOGO) up and running by 2030.

Council's Traffic and Safety team hosted another excellent forum with principals and representatives from 10 schools in our LGA in late June. Working with our school community always helps with ongoing difficulties during school drop off and pick up times. I'm sure every

resident understands the problem of narrow streets and congestion around our 16 schools, and that our main aim is to keep our children safe. Please work with your school to ensure the safety of our students and residents.

I am delighted to announce that Council's application to set up a live site for the FIFA Women's World Cup has been approved by Optus. We will be screening the games featuring the Australian National team at Strathfield Square from 20 July. Grab a bite to eat at one of the local businesses and join us as we cheer on the Matildas!

On behalf of Strathfield Council, I wish to congratulate Strathfield Girls High School Principal Mechel Pikoulas, on receiving the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) as part of the King's Birthday 2023 Honours List for service to education. Having been a teacher for 30 years and a principal for 10 years, Mechel's dedication to all students in her care is admirable.

Lighting Artwork – New Pedestrian Bridges

The Parramatta Road Urban Amenity Improvement Plan (PRUAIP) is a \$198 million initiative funded by the NSW Government to improve open space and active transport links along the Parramatta Road corridor.

As part of this initiative, high quality art projects have been installed on the Powells Creek pedestrian bridges, which aim to create a visual impact on the area and to enhance the cultural and heritage assets for the local community to enjoy.

Hamilton Street Bridge

The installation of lighting on the Hamilton Street bridge will be completed in August. The artwork on this bridge focuses on Mason Park Wetlands being a sustainable environment which is over twelve hectares in size.

Lorraine Street Bridge

The installation of lighting on the Lorraine Street bridge is scheduled to be completed in September. The artwork on this bridge focuses on Strathfield's diversity and inclusive community, highlighting diversity in all its forms.







Bridge Road Public Domain Improvement- Homebush

The construction of new footpaths with pavers and installation of street furniture along Bridge Road, Homebush is successfully underway. This project is funded by the NSW Government and is scheduled to be completed by the end of this month. These domain improvement works aim to enhance the infrastructure and aesthetics of a busy entry point into the Strathfield local government area.
