The Strathfield School for Seniors was established in 1977, when the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational Churches combined to form the Uniting Church. John Woodhouse, Minister of the Carrington Avenue Church led a committee consisting of both church and community members with an aim to establish classes in the fields of history, geography, art, French, German, craft, and music appreciation. It is these classes that are now part of The Strathfield School for Seniors.

Classes continue today, providing an opportunity for residents with similar interests to meet, engage and learn. It is this social interaction and getting out of the house to be active that is beneficial for all who attend. Learning does not have to cease once we leave school.
